

## Harthill and Thorpe Salvin Walk amendment

These are the full instructions, but with the new diversion marked in yellow.



Turn left from the car park entrance then left at the junction and after a few yards take the marked footpath on the right up some steps. Follow this in a straight line, crossing a road and then over the fields.

As you reach a wood and the path starts to bear to the left, there's another path going to the right along the edge of the wood; follow it to the road (Common Road). The three wind turbines at Loscar Farm loom large here. Go left for a few yards on the road and take the marked footpath off right. Field paths can be muddy here after rain, but the land seems to drain quite quickly. Go over another minor road and keep going in a straight line for about half a mile until you reach a clear track.

~~Go left here and into Thorpe Salvin village — the Parish Oven pub/restaurant is straight opposite.~~

~~Carry straight on for a further half mile and then go left onto Southard's Lane. When you reach Common Road go left into Thorpe Salvin village. When you reach Worksop Road go left again passing the Parish Oven pub/restaurant.~~

Turn left along the road then right in front of St Peter's Church, with the remains of Thorpe Salvin Hall (private) ahead. Follow the road round – it's fairly quiet but take care and keep in single file. Carry on past the row of houses and keep going till you come to a Public Bridleway sign on the right. Go down the hill beside the hedge, over the bridge then round onto the towpath, under the bridge then follow the towpath back to Kiveton Park station. Here you cross the road and go back onto the towpath.

Keep going past the eastern portal of Norwood Tunnel and carry straight on the field track to the metal gate and road.

Cross busy Hall Lane with care and take the path sharp left just inside the entrance to Kiveton Waters. Follow this round and along an embankment. At the end go right, over the steel bridge and turn left (on the line the canal will take when restored). A few yards further on there's a path off left that skirts the mound and follow the path alongside Broad Bridge Dyke – which draws water from Harthill reservoir and fills the canal. (If you are feeling energetic divert and take the snaking path up the hill for a good view.)

When you come to a stout stone bridge on the left, cross it and follow the path, turning right when you reach the road. Go up through the village and then turn right along Jackys Lane, which is just before the Co-op, then through the metal gate down the hill back to the start point.
